Origins of Arabian Nights (Persian, Indian and Arabic roots);

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Arabian Nights in East
(Arabian Nights were passed orally for long eras, several anonymous narrators, frame narrative);

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Arabian Nights in West
(French orientalist Antoine Galland (1646 - 1715) was the
first to introduce *The Arabian Nights* to audiences outside
the Middle East, translated into French between 1704 1713 third of the manuscripts he had brought from the
Orient. This translation became popular since Galland
formulated it to suit the European cultural standards in the
18th century);
